The Whatcom Transportation Policy Board has recently approved an amendment to its 2013-16 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). WCOG submits this amendment to your department in preparation for the Governor's review and approval, and for approval into the statewide TIP.

The projects in this amendment were available for public review and comment at a public hearing on September 11, 2013. SUBJECT: Recommendation for approval of the September 2013 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments

The Strategic Planning Division's Transportation Planning Office coordinated internally with the Highways and Local Programs Division, the Public Transportation Division, and the Capital Program Development and Management Division to review five Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) TIP amendments for September 2013. We find these TIP amendments substantially meet the requirements stated in Title 23 United States Code, Section 134 and Title 49 United States Code, Section 53. The projects in these TIP amendments use federal, state, and local funds and are financially constrained.

2013-2016 STIP Amendment 13-09

Dear Ms. Peterson:

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) received the October 1, 2013, letter and subsequent revised STIP Amendment on October 7, 2013, from Ms. Stephanie Tax requesting approval of 2013-2016 STIP Amendment 13-09. The revised STIP Amendment separated FHWA and FTA projects so that, during the national government shutdown this month, FHWA could review and approve FHWA-only projects. FTA projects were separated and sent to the two agencies; FTA staff will review the FTA-only projects upon their return from the government furlough.

Pursuant to 23 CFR 450.328 we find that the TIP Amendments for Puget Sound Regional Council and Spokane Regional Transportation Council, conform with the State Implementation Plan for reducing the severity and number of National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) violations and insuring expeditious attainment of the standards.

In accordance with 23 CFR 450.218, the FHWA and FTA, based on the Certification of the statewide and metropolitan transportation planning processes for and within the State of Washington, hereby finds that the projects described in the 2013-2016 STIP approved January 7, 2013, and FHWA finds that those projects submitted through subsequent amendments (including this Amendment 13-09), are based on a transportation planning process that substantially meets the requirements of 23 CFR Part 450 Subpart A, B and C, 49 U.S.C.
