Safety Discussion

Hugh Conroy discussed a federal safety grant recently awarded to the Whatcom Council of Governments from the U.S. Department of Transportation's <u>Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program</u>. The funds will be used to develop a regional transportation safety action plan.

Some other safety-related items discussed:

- The City of Bellingham's <u>SeeClickFix</u> application allows the public to instantly report nonemergency transportation issues with public works.
- Similarly, WCOG's 2021 Public Engagement Survey included an exercise where respondents plotted specific locations of where they have experienced "transportation challenges." You can read the <u>final survey report here</u>.
