- Bellingham: Meridian Street/Birchwood Avenue Roundabout
- Small Cities: Bradley Road Safe Routes to School Pedestrian Improvements
- Whatcom County: Support for County and Local Road Repairs Resulting from November 2021 Catastrophic Flooding
- WTA: Planning and Design to Expand Bellingham Station.

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MOTION: Mr. Fleetwood moved, seconded by Mr. Lilliquist, to adopt the aforementioned funding requests as the region's four top priorities.
