Notice to the Public Regarding Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

WCOG hereby gives public notice that it is the policy of the agency to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Executive Order 12898 on Environmental Justice, Executive Order 13166 on Limited English Proficiency, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI requires that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which WCOG receives federal financial assistance.

Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with WCOG. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the WCOG Title VI Coordinator within one-hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence. Title VI Discrimination Complaint Forms may be obtained from the WCOG at no cost and are available on WCOG's website.

Aviso al Público Sobre Título VI de la Ley de Derechos Civiles de 1964

Por medio de la presente, el WCOG notifica de manera pública que la política del organismo es garantizar el pleno cumplimiento del Título VI de la Ley de Derechos Civiles de 1964, la Ley de Recuperación de Derechos Civiles de 1987, el Decreto Presidencial 12898 sobre Justicia Ambiental, el Decreto Presidencial 13166 sobre Dominio Limitado del Idioma Inglés, así como los estatutos y reglamentos relacionados en todos los programas y actividades. De acuerdo con lo estipulado en el Título VI, ningún individuo de los Estados Unidos de América deberá, con fundamento en su raza, color, sexo o nacionalidad, ser excluido de participar en, que se le nieguen los beneficios de, o ser víctima de discriminación en virtud de calquier programa o actividad por el cual el WCOG reciba fondos federales.

Toda persona que se considere agraviada por una práctica discriminatoria e ilícita en virtud del Título VI tiene derecho a presentar una denuncia formal ante el WCOG. Cualquier denuncia de este tipo debe presentarse por escrito ante el coordinador del Título VI del WCOG en un period de 180 días naturales a partir de la fecha de la presunta discriminación. El WCOG pone a disposición del público los formularios de denuncia del Título VI de manera gratuita en su página web.

MOTION: Mr. Lilliquist moved, second by Mr. Williams, to adopt the Whatcom Council of Governments' Title VI Plan, as presented.

H. NEW BUSINESS

1. Appointment of Three Small Cities' Representatives to the Executive Committee

MOTION: Mr. May moved, second by Mr. Briscoe, to appoint Mr. Hansen of Ferndale, Mr. Hester of Nooksack, and Mr. Korthuis of Lynden to the Executive Committee.

MOTION PASSED

2. Election of Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary-Treasurer

MOTION: Ms. Bosch moved, second by Mr. May, to appoint Mr. Korthuis to serve as chairman, Mr. Lilliquist to serve as vice-chairman, and Mr. Hansen to serve as secretary-treasurer.

MOTION PASSED

3. Amend WCOG Procurement Policy

Mr. Cubellis explained the need to amend the Procurement Policy and described the recommended revisions.

MOTION: Ms. Lilliquist moved, second by Mr. Briscoe, to approve the modifications to the Procurement Policy, as presented.

MOTION PASSED

4. Amend WCOG Bylaws

Mr. Cubellis described the proposed modifications to the Bylaws.

MOTION: Ms. Hester moved, second by Mr. Briscoe, to approve the modifications to the Bylaws of the Whatcom Council of Governments, as presented.

MOTION PASSED

5. Amend WCOG Personnel Manual

Mr. Cubellis described the proposed modifications to the Personnel Manual.

MOTION: Ms. Lilliquist moved, second by Mr. Briscoe, to approve the modification pertaining to Section 6.5 "Life Insurance," as presented, but to revise the language pertaining to Section 5.1 "Vacation", as follows: "The Executive Director may start a new employee at a vacation accrual year greater than Year 1 when the employee's work history or market conditions warrant such an adjustment. In no case shall such an adjustment exceed the maximum monthly accrual rate approved by the Council Board."

MOTION PASSED

6. Adopt 2023 Cost Allocation Plan

Mr. Cubellis explained the need to adopt a cost allocation plan annually, and then described the proposed 2023 WCOG Cost Allocation Plan.

MOTION: Ms. Williams moved, second by Mr. Hester, to approve the 2023 WCOG Cost Allocation Plan, as presented.

7. Adopt New Member Information Form

Subject: **Procurement Policy Amendment**

Staff is recommending the following modification to the Procurement Policy following a compliance review by the Washington State Department of Transportation's Public Transportation Division as stewards of funding from the Federal Transit Administration:

1) Replace the existing reference to the WCOG Complaint Policy with a more detailed appeal and protest procedure suggested by the state.

The affected pages follow. Here is a link to the whole policy as it current exists: <u>WCOG Procurement Policy</u>.

SUGGESTED MOTION: Move to approve the amend the Procurement Policy, as presented.

- The RFP/Q must be publicized and should identify all evaluation factors and their relative importance, and all complete and timely submittals will be considered;
- Proposals or qualifications must be solicited from at least 2 qualified sources;
- A method shall be established for conducting technical evaluations of the proposals and qualifications received as part of the development of the RFP/Q;
- For RFPs, the proposal most advantageous to the program will be selected, even when the preferred proposal is not the lowest-priced;
- For RFQs, competitors' qualifications will be evaluated and the most qualified competitor will be selected, subject to negotiation of fair and reasonable compensation;
- The Executive Director signs all contracts; and
- Contracts greater than \$\$100,000 require approval by the WCOG's Executive Board or Council Board.

Noncompetitive Proposal

Procurement through solicitation of only one source (sole source) may be used when at least one of the following applies:

- The item is available only from a single source;
- Exigent circumstances (e.g., significant damage to the building requirement immediate attention) will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation;
- The granting agency authorizes noncompetitive negotiations;
- After solicitation of at least two (2) sources, competition is determined to be infeasible.

The Executive Director must review all noncompetitive proposals, and all noncompetitive proposals over \$100,000 shall require Executive Board or Council Board approval.

Other Government or Cooperative Contracts

Competition is not required when purchases of supplies, services or equipment are made through competitively secured contracts executed by other government agencies or bonafide cooperative purchasing agreements, such as purchases of telephone service, software and computer equipment through vendor contracts negotiated by the State of Washington.

Intergovernmental Purchasing

Services provided by qualified public-sector agencies through intergovernmental agreements with any governmental entity, whether federal, state or local, shall be exempt from the competitive solicitation requirements.

Architectural and Engineering Services

The requirements outlined in RCW 39.80 must be followed to procure professional architectural or engineering services.

4.0 **VENDOR APPEALS APPEAL AND PROTEST PROCEDURES**

Vendors may appeal or protest a proposal solicitation or award of contract issued by the WCOG, by following the procedures described in the WCOG Complaint Policy. Any bidder, contractor

or vendor who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a bid or contracted products and services may file an appeal with Whatcom Council of Governments. Bidders, contractors or vendors may submit an appeal of an award to the Executive Director in accordance with the following procedure:

- 1. Bidder, contractor or vendor shall submit an appeal no later than five (5) business days after notification of the bid award. Such appeals must be received by the Executive Director no later than 5:00 p.m. within five (5) days of notice of award postmark date.
- 2. All appeals must be in writing and signed by the bidder or an authorized agent of the bidder.
- 3. The appeal shall include the name and address of the bidder, contractor or vendor.
- 4. The appeal shall include a detailed description of the facts and disagreement that form the basis of the bidder's, contractor's or vendor's appeal and supporting documentation and the specific decision requested. The bidder, contractor or vendor shall also promptly provide any additional documentation related to the appeal upon request from the Executive Director.
- 5. The Executive Director or authorized representative of Whatcom Council of Governments will provide the allegedly aggrieved bidder, contractor or vendor with a written decision within five (5) business days after receipt of the appeal. The decision by the Executive Director of Whatcom Council of Governments is final. If additional time is mutually agreed on, the Executive Director shall notify the bidder, contractor or vendor of any delay.
- 6. Failure to comply with the appeal procedure shall render an appeal untimely or inadequate and result in rejection by Whatcom Council of Governments.

In the case of Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT)-grant funded operation, the vendor may further file a protest of the decision that resulted in the appeal process to WSDOT. The protest to WSDOT shall include a detailed description of the facts and disagreement that form the basis of the bidder's, contractor's or vendor's protest and supporting documentation and the specific decision requested.

5.0 COMPLIANCE WITH POLICY

Willful violation of any of the provisions of this policy may result in disciplinary action under WCOG's personnel policies.

6.0 GLOSSARY

Appropriation

WCOG Board authorization to expend funds for a specific purpose.

Competitive Bidding

The submission of prices by individuals or firms competing for a contract, privilege, or right to supply merchandise or services.

Subject: Adoption of WSDOT's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program

Participation Plan

As a recipient of federal financial assistance, WCOG is subject to Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations Part 26 Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE). And as a sub-recipient of the federal funding through the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT), WCOG is required to comply with WSDOT's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program Participation Plan. Complying with WSDOT's plan meets our federal obligations.

WSDOT's plan has gone through a lot of changes since WCOG last adopted it in 2001. The WSDOT Public Transportation Division requires that we do that more frequently than every 20+ years. Going forward, we will re-adopt the plan when WSDOT updates it. An update is required every 3 years.

The objectives of the plan are:

- a. To ensure nondiscrimination in the award and administration of USDOT-assisted highway, transit, and airport contracts;
- b. To create a level playing field on which DBEs can compete fairly for USDOT- assisted contracts;
- c. To ensure that the DBE program is narrowly tailored in accordance with applicable law;
- d. To ensure that only firms that fully meet DBE eligibility standards are permitted to participate as DBEs;
- e. To help remove barriers to DBE participation in USDOT-assisted contracts;
- f. To promote the use of DBEs in all types of USDOT-assisted contracts and procurement activities conducted by recipients/sub-recipients;
- g. To assist the development of firms that can compete successfully in the marketplace outside of the DBE program; and
- h. To provide flexibility to recipients/sub-recipients in establishing and providing opportunities for DBEs.
