Notice to the Public Regarding Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

WCOG hereby gives public notice that it is the policy of the agency to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, Executive Order 12898 on Environmental Justice, Executive Order 13166 on Limited English Proficiency, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI requires that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which WCOG receives federal financial assistance.

Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with WCOG. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the WCOG Title VI Coordinator within one-hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence. Title VI Discrimination Complaint Forms may be obtained from the WCOG at no cost and are available on WCOG's website.

Aviso al Público Sobre Título VI de la Ley de Derechos Civiles de 1964

Por medio de la presente, el WCOG notifica de manera pública que la política del organismo es garantizar el pleno cumplimiento del Título VI de la Ley de Derechos Civiles de 1964, la Ley de Recuperación de Derechos Civiles de 1987, el Decreto Presidencial 12898 sobre Justicia Ambiental, el Decreto Presidencial 13166 sobre Dominio Limitado del Idioma Inglés, así como los estatutos y reglamentos relacionados en todos los programas y actividades. De acuerdo con lo estipulado en el Título VI, ningún individuo de los Estados Unidos de América deberá, con fundamento en su raza, color, sexo o nacionalidad, ser excluido de participar en, que se le nieguen los beneficios de, o ser víctima de discriminación en virtud de calquier programa o actividad por el cual el WCOG reciba fondos federales.

Toda persona que se considere agraviada por una práctica discriminatoria e ilícita en virtud del Título VI tiene derecho a presentar una denuncia formal ante el WCOG. Cualquier denuncia de este tipo debe presentarse por escrito ante el coordinador del Título VI del WCOG en un period de 180 días naturales a partir de la fecha de la presunta discriminación. El WCOG pone a disposición del público los formularios de denuncia del Título VI de manera gratuita en su página web.

A. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chairman Korthuis, acting as chairman, called the meeting to order at 3:32 p.m. with a quorum present.

B. PUBLIC COMMENT

No comment was offered.

C. AGENDA APPROVAL

Chairman Korthuis requested that the agenda be amended to add a new action item, "Petty Cash Policy." Mr. Wilson explained that the need for such a policy had just been brought to his attention upon the conclusion of WCOG's biennial accountability that week.

MOTION: Mr. Bornemann moved, Mr. Sidhu seconded, to approve the minutes of the meeting of October 9, 2019.

E. APPROVAL OF CLAIMS

Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Bornemann seconded, to approve the list of claims from October 1 through November 26, 2019, inclusive, in the amount of \$279,787.73, which was e-mailed to the representatives on December 6, 2019, and which was audited and certified by the Executive Director, acting as the Auditing Officer as required by RCW 42.24.090.

H. PUBLIC HEARING

WCOG Combined Title VI and Limited English Proficiency Plan ("the Plan")

Mr. Wilson described the rationale for adopting the Plan and the process he used in developing it. Ms. Frazey requested that those sections of the Plan which were translated into Spanish by the Spanish language translation consultant hired by WCOG be reviewed by a native Spanish speaker, and Mr. Wilson said he would make the necessary arrangements.

MOTION: Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Jones seconded, to adopt Whatcom Council of Governments' Resolution No. 2019-01, "Adopting WCOG's Combined Title VI and Limited English Proficiency Plan."

I. NEW BUSINESS

Proposed 2020 WCOG Budget

Messrs. Cubellis and Wilson presented the final draft of the proposed 2020 budget and answered questions posed by several Board members. Chairman Korthuis informed the Board that, at its meeting immediately preceding the Council Board

meeting, the Executive Committee reviewed the proposed budget and passed a motion recommending that the Council Board adopt it.

MOTION: Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Briscoe seconded, to adopt the 2020 Budget, as presented.

MOTION PASSED

2. Rank Unfunded Transportation Needs of Whatcom County, 2020

Following a lengthy discussion of the various options for ranking the road project funding requests adopted at the October Council Board meeting, there was consensus to send the list to both the region's state and federal legislative delegations without ranking them, but emphasizing in the cover memo that the projects for which funding is requested emphasize safety.

MOTION: Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Briscoe seconded, to adopt the list of *Transportation Priorities of Whatcom County*, 2020, without ranking the road projects, but with the revisions to the cover memo agreed upon by the Council Board.

3. 2020 Census Complete Count Committee

Mr. Coe and Ms. Ingram explained the purpose of and need for a regional "Complete Count Committee."

MOTION: Ms. Barker moved, Mr. Bornemann seconded, to establish and facilitate the Whatcom Complete Count Committee and Work Group.

MOTION PASSED

4. WCOG Public Records Policy

Mr. Cubellis explained the purpose of and need for a public records policy.

MOTION: Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Jones seconded, to approve the Whatcom Council of Governments' Public Records Policy, as presented.

MOTION PASSED

5. WCOG Credit Card Program

Mr. Cubellis explained the purpose of and need for a credit card program.

MOTION: Ms. Onyon moved, Mr. Briscoe seconded, to approve the Whatcom Council of Governments' Credit Card Program, as presented.

MOTION PASSED

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6. Approve Border Data Warehouse 3.0 Consultant Agreement

Ms. Fanucci explained the Border Data Warehouse program and the purpose of the pending consulting work.

MOTION: Mr. Briscoe moved, Ms. Frazey seconded, to authorize the Executive Director to enter into a professional services agreement with The IBI Group in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

7. Adopt WCOG Petty Cash Policy

Mr. Cubellis explained the purpose of and need for a petty cash policy.

MOTION: Mr. Louws moved, Mr. Briscoe seconded, to adopt the Whatcom Council of Governments' Petty Cash Policy, as presented.

J. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Wilson stated that he had nothing of urgency to report and ceded his time to Chairman Korthuis, who presented certificates of appreciation to Ms. Linville and Messrs. Bornemann, Louws and Mutchler – all of whom will be retiring from public service at the end of 2019 – for their exemplary service to WCOG and the region.

WHEREAS, the Whatcom Council of Governments is the designated conference of governments authorized by the Washington State Legislature and established in 1966, serving the local governments, tribes and special districts of Whatcom County, and

WHEREAS, the Government of the United States of America will conduct its decennial Census of Population in April 2020, the results of which will be used to determine the number of seats apportioned to each State in the U.S. House of Representatives, and to establish formulas for the distribution of federal funding to the States, and

WHEREAS, the Whatcom Council of Governments acknowledges the great importance of the Census to Whatcom County and its constituent cities, as well as to the State of Washington and the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Whatcom Council of Governments is committed to ensuring that all residents of Whatcom County are counted, and to that end established by motion the Whatcom Complete Count Committee at its meeting of December 11, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BY THIS RESOLUTION the Whatcom Council of Governments affirms its establishment of the Whatcom Complete Count Committee and pledges its full cooperation and assistance to ensure a complete count of all residents of Whatcom County in the 2020 Census.

Request to Add Kendall Safety Trail Phase to Legislative Requests

As some of you are aware, WCOG has been working with community members in the Kendall-Columbia Valley to develop a bicycle and pedestrian safety trail along State Route 547. That corridor has been the sight of at least three fatalities, the last of which was a 14 year-old boy riding his bike home from visiting a friend, four years ago this month. With funding from the State Legislature acquired through the efforts of Rep. Van Werven, a 30 percent design study has just been completed. The consulting engineers have determined that the total cost to build the 3.15-mile safety trail is just over \$4-million, although it is anticipated that it would be built in phases over a period of several years.

The community respectfully requests that the Council Board add the following funding request to the *Transportation Priorities of Whatcom County*, 2020, which was approved last month:

\$1.1-million to the Washington State Department of Transportation to construct Segments C and D of the SR 547 Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Trail, from the East Whatcom Regional Resource Center to Oregon Trail Road, as delineated in the 30% Design prepared by Wilson Engineering under its contract with the Whatcom Council of Governments.
