#### A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bromley called the meeting to order at 3:53 p.m. with a quorum present.

## B. PUBLIC COMMENT

No public comment was received.

# C. AGENDA APPROVAL

Mr. Wilson requested that an action item be added to the agenda under New Business: "Amendment to 2017 Unfunded Transportation Needs List."

**MOTION**: Mr. Korthuis moved, Mr. Robinson seconded, to approve the agenda with the addition requested by the Executive Director.

#### **MOTION PASSED**

#### D. CONSENT AGENDA

**MOTION:** Mr. Robinson moved, Mr. McAuley seconded, to approve the consent agenda, which included approval of the minutes of the Council Board meeting of December 14, 2016, and December 2016 claims Nos. 2016381 to 2016408, inclusive, in the amount of \$138,399.83.

## **MOTION PASSED**

## E. BUDGET REPORT

Mr. Cubellis presented the budget report as of December 31, 2016.

## G. NEW BUSINESS

# G.1 Banking Resolution

Mr. Cubellis reminded the Board that at its meeting in December 2016, it authorized staff to open checking and saving accounts at Washington Federal Bank, and it adopted a resolution to that effect. Subsequently, County Treasurer Steve Oliver informed Mr. Cubellis that the Revised Code of Washington appears to require councils of governments to deposit their funds with one of their member counties, and to use only that county's bank. His interpretation was confirmed by the State Auditor's Office, and the result is that WCOG cannot open a saving account anywhere, and it cannot hold a checking account at Washington Federal since that is not Whatcom County's bank (Key Bank is). For those reasons, the resolution adopted by the Board in December is rendered moot. Mr. Cubellis requested that the Board adopt a new resolution amending the one it passed in December.

**MOTION:** Mr. Lilliquist moved, Mr. Jones seconded, to approve Resolution No. 17-01-1, modifying Resolution No. 16-12-1 to allow for checking accounts to be opened at Key Bank.

## **MOTION PASSED**

# G.2 Approval of the 2017 Non-Member Fee Schedule

Mr. Cubellis reminded the Board that the schedule of fees for entities that are not members of WCOG but which contract with it for services must be updated every January.

**MOTION:** Mr. Korthuis moved, Mr. Lilliquist seconded, to approve the 2017 Fee Schedule as presented.

# **MOTION PASSED**

G.3 Appointment of Three Small Cities Members to the Executive Committee

Messrs. Bromley, Jones and Robinson agreed to serve on the Executive Committee in 2017, at the pleasure of the Board.

**MOTION:** Mr. Korthuis moved, Mr. McAuley seconded, to appoint the representatives from the cities of Blaine, Nooksack and Sumas to the Executive Committee.

## **MOTION PASSED**

# G.4 Amendments to WCOG Bylaws

Mr. Wilson explained that the amendments to the Bylaws he was recommending would remove the requirement that officers be elected at an "annual meeting" in December, which is impracticable, and require the election to occur at the first meeting of the year; would formalize the longstanding practice of the Council Board's officers also serving as the officers of the Whatcom Transportation Policy Board, and; would require that candidates for Council Board officer seats also be eligible to serve on the Policy Board.

**MOTION:** Mr. Korthuis moved, Mr. Alesse seconded, to approve the proposed amendments to the Bylaws of the Whatcom Council of Governments.

## **MOTION PASSED**

# G.5 Amendments to Whatcom Transportation Policy Board Bylaws

Mr. Wilson explained that the amendments to the Council Board bylaws that just passed necessitate that the Policy Board bylaws be amended to remove the requirement that it elect its own officers. He also proposed removing the requirement that each of the member jurisdictions inform WCOG staff every year whom their Transportation Technical Advisory Group representative will be, and replacing TTAG "member" with "representative," since the members of TTAG are the jurisdictions themselves.

**MOTION:** Mr. Robinson moved, Mr. Alesse seconded, to approve the proposed amendments to the Bylaws of the Whatcom Transportation Policy Board.

# G.6 Election of Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary-Treasurer

Mr. Wilson informed the Board that Chairman Bromley, Vice-Chairman McAuley and Secretary-Treasurer Jack Louws had all agreed to serve in their respective positions in 2017, at the Board's pleasure. No other representatives chose to seek office.

**MOTION:** Mr. Jones moved, Mr. Robinson seconded, to appoint Bob Bromley as chairman, Michael McAuley as Vice-Chairman, and Jack Louws as Secretary-Treasurer.

## **MOTION PASSED**

# G.7 Amendment to 2017 Unfunded Transportation Needs List

Mr. Wilson reminded the Board that WCOG staff has been working with concerned citizens in Kendall as well as with the Washington State Department of Transportation and Whatcom County to address a serious pedestrian and bicycle safety situation along State Route 547, on which at least four people have been killed by vehicles. In the 2016 State Legislative Session, Rep. Luanne Van Werven was able to secure about \$75,000 in funding to enable WCOG – on behalf of the Kendall community – to engage a consulting engineer to undertake the initial preliminary engineering for the development of a 3.15-mile "State Route 547 Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Trail" that would enable children and adults to safely access key destinations in the community, including Kendall Elementary School, the East Whatcom Resource Center, the library and the community's two churches. That work is progressing and will be completed shortly.

The next step in advancing this project is to get it to the 30 percent design level, perform topographical and geotechnical analyses, and begin wetland delineation. Mr. Wilson requested that the Board add this request to the transportation needs list it adopted in September 2016, in the amount of \$305,000 plus a three percent administrative fee charged by the Department of Commerce. He added that Rep. Van Werven has agreed to pursue this request.

**MOTION:** Mr. Korthuis moved, Mr. Jones seconded, to add preliminary engineering for the State Route 547 Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Trail to the list of Unfunded Transportation Needs of Whatcom County 2017, in the amount of \$315,000.

Mr. Lilliquist asked Mr. Wilson if he thought this request would "compete" with the other four requests previously adopted by the Board. Mr. Wilson responded that he did not believe that would be the case given that this request – unlike the others – is for preliminary engineering and not construction, and due to the relatively small amount being requested.

Subject: 2018 Budget (First Draft)

Attached to this memo please find the first draft of WCOG's 2018 Budget for your review prior to the Council Board meeting on September 13<sup>th</sup>. I draw your attention to the following:

<u>Dues.</u> Dues are determined using both population and the average cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) of the member jurisdictions. Annual population change is drawn from Office of Financial Management estimates for Whatcom County, the seven cities and the Lummi Nation. For the purposes of this draft budget, the 2.11 percent COLA that the staff is receiving this year is used as an estimate for 2018 (in accordance with the Council Board's budget guidance of September 17, 2008). The Port's dues increase is the average increase of the nine jurisdictions. When the members' 2018 COLAs are determined in the fall they will be averaged and incorporated into the final draft of the budget that will be presented to the Council Board in December.

Salaries. Based on recent statewide salary survey data, salaries will be adjusted for Principal Planner Melissa Fanucci, Senior Planner Lethal Coe and Program Specialist II Kirsten Wert, but they will all remain within their respective "salary bands" on the Board-adopted salary matrix. Planner I Jaymes McClain will be promoted to Planner II. The other staff members except me will receive step increases, and everyone will receive the COLA, which for the purpose of this draft budget is the 2.11 percent COLA we are receiving this year. It should be noted, however, that Susan and Kirsten are permanent part-time staff (56.5 and 80 percent time, respectively), and the amount of their increases will be prorated accordingly.

With the recent resignation of Mary Anderson, that position has been restructured from a full-time, mid-level (Planner II) position to a much lower-level "Program Assistant" position, which will also be part-time, budgeted at 30 hours (75 percent time) per week.

The result of all of these adjustments is an aggregate increase in 2018 salaries of \$30,311, or 4.5 percent.

<u>Employee Benefits.</u> The COG's 2018 expense for all employee benefits – health insurance, retirement, workers comp, etc. – is expected to decrease next year by 0.6 percent. This slight

reduction is primarily attributable to the significant savings to be realized when Mary and her family are no longer covered under WCOG's health insurance plan, which will more than offset the estimated 10 to 16 percent rate increase that the Association of Washington Cities anticipates for next year. The final draft of this budget will reflect actual 2018 premium costs when it is presented to the Council Board in December.

Consultants. The largest line-item increase in the 2018 Budget is the consultant expense, which will be approximately \$390,000 more than the amount budgeted for the current year. Consultants will be used on a number of projects, including the regional household travel survey, updating the regional travel demand model, and a joint traffic data collection project with the Skagit Council of Governments. These projects are funded, and consultant and other project expenses will be reimbursed.

Subject: **Proposed 2018 Transportation Funding Requests** 

At the Council Board meeting on Wednesday you will be asked to adopt a set of transportation funding requests for the consideration of the State Legislature in its 2018 session. Requests have been put forth by the cities of Blaine and Lynden, WCOG (on behalf of the Kendall community), Whatcom County, and a joint request from the City of Bellingham, Western Washington University and WTA. Brief descriptions of these requests follow:

# **Blaine**

I-5 Exit 274 Interchange Justification Report (IJR) – This request would fund an update of the IJR that was prepared for Exit 274 in 2009. The City is working with WSDOT to develop a "practical solution" to address the lack of southbound access to Blaine's city center from I-5 south of Exit 276, congestion from northbound I-5 to the Pacific Highway port-of-entry to British Columbia, and deficient freeway access to the Blaine Industrial Area. This request is necessitated as a result of the defunding in 2016 of the \$45-million Exit 274 interchange improvements project contained in Connecting Washington, and the Governor's veto of a \$12-million project at this location included in the adopted State Transportation Budget in 2017. Request: To be determined

## **Lynden**

**Duffner Ditch Culvert Replacement** – This project would replace the existing twin 48-inch concrete culverts with an 18-foot by 6-foot by 130-foot box culvert. It is currently at the 60 percent level for plans and is fully permitted, as it is included in WSDOT's plan for the widening of State Route 539. All necessary right-of-way for the project has been obtained. This culvert is on WSDOT's "Fish Passage Barrier" list that requires corrective action per the Federal Court Injunction. Construction in advance of the larger widening project would allow that project to be completed with fewer impacts on travelers. Request: \$3.4-million

WCOG (on behalf of the Kendall-Columbia Valley community)

**Kendall Highway Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Trail** – This request would fund 30 percent design, topographical and geotechnical analyses, and wetland delineation needed for the development of a 3.15-mile separated trail constructed along SR 547 to safely connect several large neighborhoods to key destinations in this rural, low-income community, including Kendall Elementary School, the library, the East Whatcom Regional Resource

Center, and WTA transit stops. This work would be performed by a consulting engineer under a contract with WCOG, which is overseeing this effort in consultation with Whatcom County and WSDOT. Request: \$315,000

# **Whatcom County**

I-5/Slater Road Roundabouts – This project will improve channelization and stop control by constructing five roundabouts on Slater Road at Northwest Road, Pacific Highway, I-5 northbound, I-5 southbound, and Rural Avenue. This interchange provides access to I-5 for the fast-growing area south of Ferndale and north of Bellingham which has significant industrial and commercial land uses. This area is also likely to see significant commercial development initiated by the Lummi Nation. Request: \$21-\$25-million

West Horton Road Multi-modal Corridor Extension, Phase 2 – This project would be carried out as a partnership between the City of Bellingham and Whatcom County. It would extend West Horton Road a half-mile west – from Aldrich Road to Northwest Avenue – as an arterial street with sidewalks and bicycle lanes, and a roundabout at the intersection of Horton and Northwest. Land acquisition, off-site mitigation and minimizing the road footprint will be necessary to address anticipated environmental impacts. Request: \$13-\$16-million

# WWU, Bellingham and WTA

Lincoln Creek Transportation Center Improvements – This facility – owned and operated by WWU – serves as both a park-and-ride lot and a regional transit center, providing parking for about 500 cars along with regular WTA bus service to Western and employment centers in Whatcom, Skagit and Snohomish counties. This project would correct the facility's significant surface deficiencies (uneven grade, potholes, pavement failure and inadequate drainage) and improve its storm water management infrastructure. Request: \$5-\$8-million
